Disposition of Niobe Strayhan, aka Paragyne of the Beastmen

Subject Report: Niobe "Paragyne" Strayhan

Disposition: Remanded to DoD OSI Special Research Division under AEGIS supervision

Subject Overview:

Niobe "Paragyne" Strayhan, formerly a member of the superteam known as the Beastmen, possesses ant-based powers that grant her a unique array of abilities.
