Defensive: These powers are those that can be utilized to counter or mitigate the effects of Offensive Powers or offensive maneuvers.

Motile: These powers are those related to movement capabilities that a Quasar can use to increase or grant mobility in through various physical media.

Omnimorphic: These are abilities that can modify the structure of objects internal or external to the Quasar. These abilities may be utilized externally or internally, but are often distinguished from Intramorphic powers based on their potentially offensive or defensive nature.

Intramorphic: These are abilities that are purely internal to the structure and bodily functionality of the Quasar.

Contrasensory: These are powers and abilities that confound, suppress, or hinder observation through the common or extended senses.

Hypersensory: These are powers and abilities that enhance observation through the common senses or by providing extended sensory capabilities in the range beyond normal human ability.

Metapsionic: These powers are those that relate directly to the ability to manipulate and sense intelligence from higher-level and human consciousness.

Metaquantum: These powers are those that related to the ability to alter the composition and stateful condition of matter, energy, or both through hypercondition of their quantum states.

Evaluation of Power Framework Alignments

Justification for Evaluation of Power Framework Alignments

Power structures among Quasars fall into one of three major categories, which is defined by methodological-based assumption of resource and attention to task, much of which follows the human methodologies of singular tasks, multiple tasks, or random task allocation. Quasar powers, driven by human thought methodologies, also follow his categorization (Wilman & Hyatt 1965, Newman 1983, Hugenbotter 1993).

Astructural Demonstration

Power sets aligned along Astructural Demonstration have no overall aligning thought or attention methodology [No Power Framework].

Thematic Gestalt

Thematic Gestalt sets are logically assigned along ontological and instinctual patterns of commonality by thematic assumption by their host. Example given, Air Powers, Electrical Powers, or powers aligned along those similar to a given species of lifeform. Thematic Gestalt often provide greater Q-Index values (see Section 5, Q-Index) for a suite of powers that can be deployed simultaneously. [Elemental Control Framework]

Essential Allocation

Essential Allocation sets are defined more strongly by an overall pool of allocated power which is defined periodically on a scalar set, where some powers require absolute power allocation and some powers have variable power allocation. Such sets provide a greater number of power variations, but at an overall limitation to how often many of those can be utilized simultaneously. [Multipower Pool Framework]

Effective Conflict Engagement: The Q-Index can be used in interactive mediums and analytics to determine effectiveness and scale of powers as identified for purposes of modeling and technological evaluation of Quantum powers.

Limitations and Controversies

While the Q-Index offers a systematic approach, it's not without its critics.
